

Willapa Bay and Grays Harbor — By the Numbers

Willapa Bay and Grays Harbor are two large coastal estuaries in southwest Washington, surrounded by Pacific County and Grays Harbor County. Located a mere 25 km apart, these "Twin Harbors" account for 37% of Washington's wetlands.
